

#### OUR NAME

Our name was inspired by the teaching of the Gospel of Mark (2:1-12). As the story goes, four people brought a paralyzed man to Jesus, but could not get through because of the crowd. Determined to bring him forward, the four people made an opening on the roof above Jesus and lowered the mat the man was lying on. Jesus healed him by saying "Rise, take your mat and Walk". It is our mission to help others rise above their difficulties and limitations and walk on their own.



#### OUR HISTORY

In 1998, while Hernan Bohorquez was leading a youth group called Talitha Kum in Barrio Minuto de Dios in Bogota, a very needy family came to their group meeting. Realizing that this family lived in makeshift house made of metal and cardboard, a group leader named Luz Dary Lopez took the initiative to help them. Inspired by the teachings of the Gospel, the youth group came together and helped build a foundation of a prefabricated house, constructed frames and finishes and bought furniture to complete the project. This was the first great achievement of what would become Rise and Walk Foundation.

In 2000, Hernan Bohorquez moved to the United States where he continued to support the work of the youth group, Talitha Kum. In 2006, through joint efforts the project became a charitable nonprofit organization in the United States with a branch in Bogotá, under the name Rise and Walk Foundation Inc. / Fundación Levante y Anda. Since 1998, hundreds of people have benefited from the generosity and the work of our benefactors and volunteers who started as a small group of people that wanted to enact change.





## OUR BENEFICIARIES

Over the last 13 years of service we have touched the lives of more than 350 families and 500 children.

60 children (ages 5-15) who join our programs daily Monday-Sunday 45 families who receive need-based support & assistance 15 youths (age 14-18) who attend photography workshops every Friday



Our work would not be possible without their unwavering support, and we are deeply grateful for their kindness, hard work, and dedication.










#### MAKING AN IMPACT -THRIFT SHOP
